Privacy Notice

This statement confirms the commitment of the Northumbria Coalition Against Crime to protect your privacy and to process your personal information in a manner which meets the requirements of the General Data Protection Regulations and Data Protection Act 1998.

1. This document explains what the Northumbria Coalition Against Crime (NCAC) is, why it processes its Members' personal data, and the lawful basis for that processing. It describes the kind of personal data about members that the NCAC is allowed to process, and what the NCAC can do with it.

2. **Who are we and what we do**

The Northumbria Coalition Against Crime is a registered charity, set up in March 1990 as a partnership between business, community, voluntary and statutory sectors, with a mission to reduce crime, anti-social and unacceptable behaviour in the North East.

28 years on our objectives remain the same today;

- **Reduce Crime** - Working in partnership to reduce crime and fear of crime
- **Increase Confidence** - Helping to ensure sustainable economic growth
- **Protect Communities** - Developing pro-active programmes to meet need
- **Encourage Youth** - Helping children & young people to grow and develop in the right direction

Our work divides into two distinct, but complementary parts:

- **Youth & Community Programme**
- **Business Crime Reduction**

3. NCAC's Data Controller is responsible for ensuring its compliance with the current Data Protection law and can be contacted using the above details. NCAC is registered with the Information Commissioners Office under Northumbria Coalition Against Crime as a Charity.

4. **Purpose of processing personal data**

The NCAC processes Members' personal data for the following purposes:

- a. to enable the efficient management of the NCAC; to manage the members of the NCAC including subscriptions where relevant; invitations to the NCAC's events etc;
- b. to defend the protect the NCAC in case of any Member's non-compliance with the NCAC's Protocols and Rules;
- c. to enable the NCAC to communicate efficiently to its Members by sending alerts, news items and other information which are relevant to them.

5. Lawful basis of processing

NCAC's existing contract/agreement between itself and its Members requires that Members provide their name, business postal address, email address, and telephone number to the NCAC. This contract means that the NCAC's lawful basis for processing Members' personal data is 'contract' and therefore the NCAC can process Members' personal data without their consent.

6. Categories and types of personal data processed

Name of a contact person/s, business name and location, postal and email addresses, telephone and other contact details will be processed;

No sensitive or 'special category' personal data (ethnicity, sexuality, religious beliefs etc) is processed by the NCAC.

7. Sources of personal data

NCAC obtains Members' personal data from existing contracts with Members; Members may themselves update their personal data.

8. Recipients of Members' personal data

The NCAC Board of Directors, the Data Controller, authorised NCAC staff and formally contracted Data Processors may access Members' personal data;

Members' personal data will not be passed to any third party unless the member gives permission;

NCAC will not transfer Members' personal data outside the UK.

9. Data retention period

NCAC will retain Members' personal data only for as long as each Member remains a Member; when a Member ceases to be a Member of NCAC they must confirm this at which time all associated personal data will be irrevocably deleted.

10. Members' rights

Members can obtain a copy of all their personal data held by NCAC; Members may access this at any time by application to the Data Controller (see Contact Details above).

Members can correct any erroneous data at any time any time by application to the Data Controller (see Contact Details above) or may require NCAC to correct any errors on their behalf.

At the conclusion of their Membership, Members' personal data will be permanently deleted by NCAC with the exception of email addresses associated with Incident reports (see Data Retention Period above) and may require the Data Controller to confirm such deletion. Members have the right to complain about the NCAC to the Information Commissioners Office.
